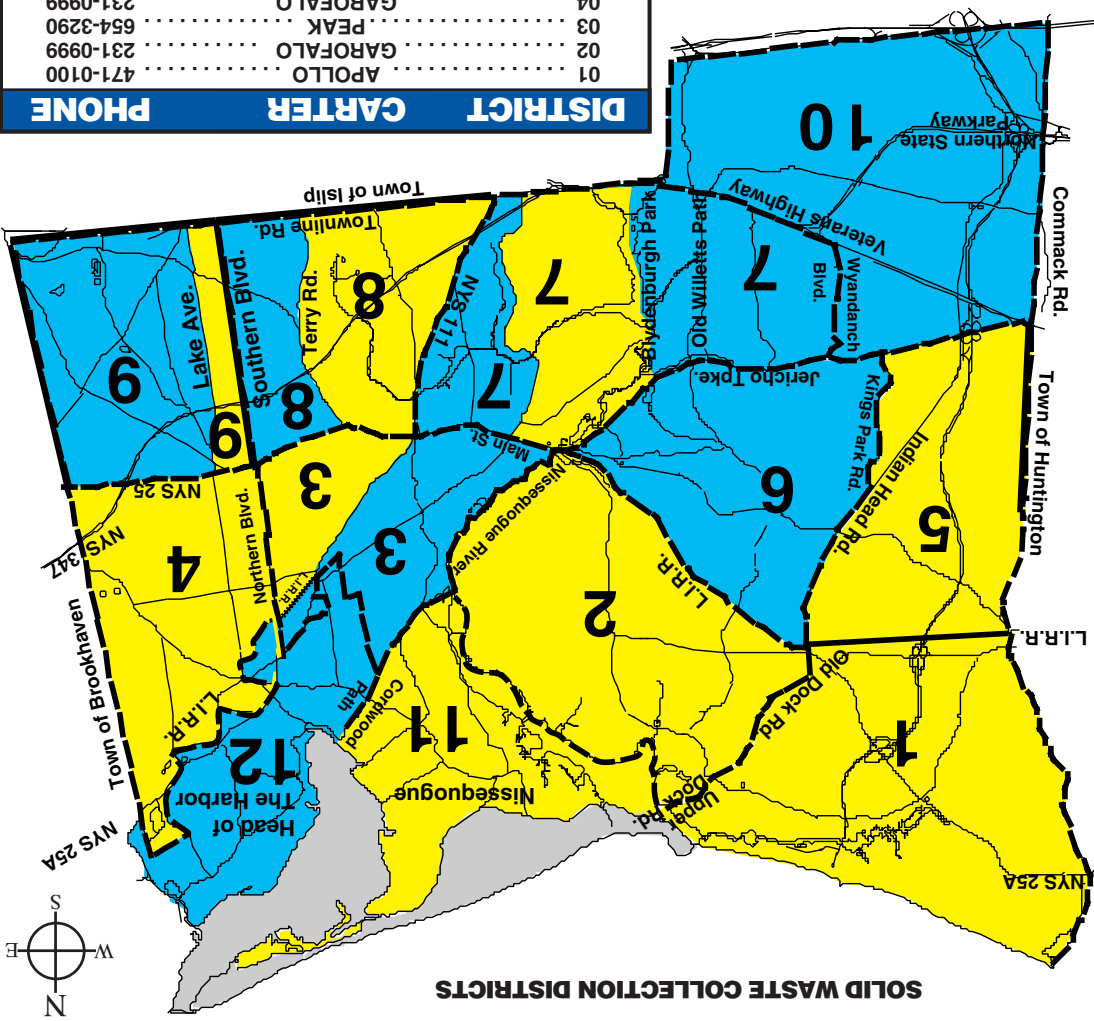

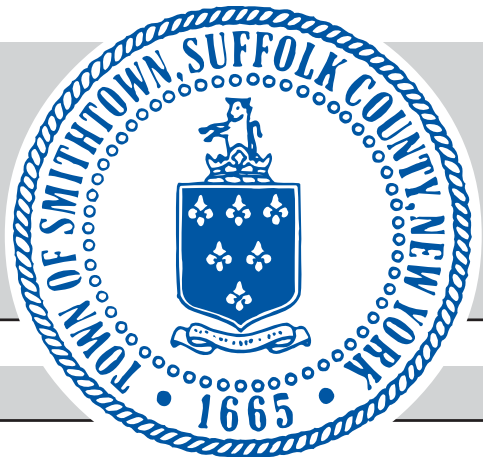

NO PICKUP Collection Is Cancelled On These Designated Holidays – *There is No Make-Up Day!*

PROTECT THE ENVIRONMENT DISPOSE OF WASTE PROPERLY!

- Never dump any household hazardous materials or other waste in storm drains. They lead directly to groundwater or local waterways!
- Dispose of used motor oil, during normal business hours, at automotive service stations, which are required to accept up to five gallons per day per person at no charge for recycling.
- Pick up pet waste and dispose of properly in the trash.
- Properly secure all trash to prevent it from being blown into storm drains or local waterways.

PAPER & CARDBOARD RECYCLING:

DO NOT recycle items like junk mail, paper towels, hard cover or paperback books or telephone books.

DO NOT recycle cereal, food, medicine, detergent, or gift boxes, soda or beer cartons.

GLASS, METAL & PLASTIC RECYCLING:

DO NOT recycle items like window glass, household dishes or crockery, drinking glasses, or colored glass other than amber, clear or green.

DO NOT recycle items like hangers or pots and pans.
(Return hangers to dry cleaners for reuse.)

DO NOT recycle syringes, toys, small plastic or squeezable bottles, plastic wrap, plastic utensils, styrofoam, or supermarket plastic bags.

PROPANE TANKS:

Because of the danger of explosion, spent propane gas tanks should never be disposed in normal trash or recycled. Spent barbecue tanks can be disposed of at propane gas retailers such as Paraco Gas, 499 East Jericho Turnpike, Smithtown, for a nominal fee.
